

Southern California Edison Company's Application for Confidential Designation
Pursuant to California Code of Regulations § 29200

I, Brandon Tolentino, declare and state:

1. I am the Vice President of Wildfire & Business Resiliency at Southern California Edison Company (SCE). As such, I have responsibility for overseeing and reviewing SCE's confidential materials being submitted to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety (OEIS). I am authorized to request confidential treatment via this application on behalf of SCE.

2. I am making this declaration pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 14, Division 17, Chapter 1, Article 1, § 29200 and in accordance with the confidentiality bases set forth and applicable California Public Utilities Commission's precedent that govern the submission of confidential documents. SCE discloses this information pursuant to these bases as confidential materials and has not disclosed the information publicly.

3. The data covered by these confidentiality bases as described in the following paragraphs is not customarily in the public domain.

4. One unredacted copy of the record containing the confidential information is included with this submission.

5. The information includes precise location, age, and other attributes of SCE's assets and facilities that are used by SCE to operate, protect, modify, and maintain SCE's utility systems.

6. The information is confidential commercial information. The information is commercial because it relates to SCE's business operations. The information is confidential because SCE customarily and actually keeps this information private and closely held. SCE restricts access to this information by employees and contractors, uses restrictive markings, and requires confidentiality agreements for access to this information. Confidential commercial information is exempt from disclosure under Exemption 4 of the Freedom of Information Act and the California Public Records Act.

7. The information is critical energy infrastructure information. The information provides details about the distribution and/or transmission of energy that could be useful to a person planning an attack on critical infrastructure, and gives strategic information beyond the location of critical infrastructure. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and Department of Energy (DOE) treats this information as exempt from the Freedom of Information Act, which does not require designation by FERC or DOE, and the California Public Records Act.

8. The information relates to utility systems development. SCE's utility system, i.e., assets and facilities, is under development. New customers and generation systems are connected each year and system assets and facilities must be maintained and upgraded by SCE. Information related to utility systems development is exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act.

9. It is in the public interest not to disclose this information. Disclosure of this information can be used by vandals and other attackers to disrupt, damage, and/or destroy SCE assets and facilities, which can result in public economic harm and safety risks. Damage or destruction of SCE assets or facilities can lead to customer outages and/or physical injury or death to vandals/attackers and surrounding property. Damage to SCE utility systems and related customer outages increases SCE's costs to mitigate or respond to these risks, which will increase the costs of electric service to SCE customers.

10. Where applicable, SCE has designated confidentiality at the data field level even though it believes confidentiality designation should be applied at the feature class level. By themselves, these data points are not necessarily confidential but when aggregated the data becomes confidential because it presents information in a form that can be taken advantage of by individuals or groups of individuals with ill intentions.

11. The data should be kept confidential indefinitely.

12. Listed below are the data for which SCE is seeking confidential protection and the basis for SCE's confidentiality request.

ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE

From time to time, Southern California Edison Company (we, us or Company) may be required by law to provide to you certain written notices or disclosures. Described below are the terms and conditions for providing to you such notices and disclosures electronically through the DocuSign system. Please read the information below carefully and thoroughly, and if you can access this information electronically to your satisfaction and agree to this Electronic Record and Signature Disclosure (ERSD), please confirm your agreement by selecting the check-box next to 'I agree to use electronic records and signatures' before clicking 'CONTINUE' within the DocuSign system.

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At any time, you may request from us a paper copy of any record provided or made available electronically to you by us. You will have the ability to download and print documents we send to you through the DocuSign system during and immediately after the signing session and, if you elect to create a DocuSign account, you may access the documents for a limited period of time (usually 30 days) after such documents are first sent to you. After such time, if you wish for us to send you paper copies of any such documents from our office to you, you will be charged a \$0.00 per-page fee. You may request delivery of such paper copies from us by following the procedure described below.

Withdrawing your consent

If you decide to receive notices and disclosures from us electronically, you may at any time change your mind and tell us that thereafter you want to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format. How you must inform us of your decision to receive future notices and disclosure in paper format and withdraw your consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically is described below.

Consequences of changing your mind

If you elect to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format, it will slow the speed at which we can complete certain steps in transactions with you and delivering services to you because we will need first to send the required notices or disclosures to you in paper format, and then wait until we receive back from you your acknowledgment of your receipt of such paper notices or disclosures. Further, you will no longer be able to use the DocuSign system to receive required notices and consents electronically from us or to sign electronically documents from us.

All notices and disclosures will be sent to you electronically

Unless you tell us otherwise in accordance with the procedures described herein, we will provide electronically to you through the DocuSign system all required notices, disclosures, authorizations, acknowledgements, and other documents that are required to be provided or made available to you during the course of our relationship with you. To reduce the chance of you inadvertently not receiving any notice or disclosure, we prefer to provide all of the required notices and disclosures to you by the same method and to the same address that you have given us. Thus, you can receive all the disclosures and notices electronically or in paper format through the paper mail delivery system. If you do not agree with this process, please let us know as described below. Please also see the paragraph immediately above that describes the consequences of your electing not to receive delivery of the notices and disclosures electronically from us.

You may contact us to let us know of your changes as to how we may contact you electronically, to request paper copies of certain information from us, and to withdraw your prior consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically as follows:

To advise Southern California Edison Company of your new email address

To let us know of a change in your email address where we should send notices and disclosures electronically to you, you must send an email message to us at IGInformationgovernance@sce.com and in the body of such request you must state: your previous email address, your new email address. We do not require any other information from you to change your email address.

If you created a DocuSign account, you may update it with your new email address through your account preferences.

To request paper copies from Southern California Edison Company

To request delivery from us of paper copies of the notices and disclosures previously provided by us to you electronically, you must send us an email to IGInformationgovernance@sce.com and in the body of such request you must state your email address, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We will bill you for any fees at that time, if any.

To withdraw your consent with Southern California Edison Company

To inform us that you no longer wish to receive future notices and disclosures in electronic format you may:

i. decline to sign a document from within your signing session, and on the subsequent page, select the check-box indicating you wish to withdraw your consent, or you may;

ii. send us an email to IGInformationgovernance@sce.com and in the body of such request you must state your email, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We do not need any other information from you to withdraw consent.. The consequences of your withdrawing consent for online documents will be that transactions may take a longer time to process..

Required hardware and software

Acknowledging your access and consent to receive and sign documents electronically
