

Summary of Key Changes in Roseville Electric Utility's 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Plan

September 14, 2021

This document provides a summary of the key changes between Roseville Electric Utility's current Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) (effective January 1, 2021), and Roseville's prior Wildfire Mitigation Plan (effective January 1, 2020). As part of its 2021 submission to the Wildfire Safety Advisory Board (WSAB), Roseville Electric Utility provided an Informational Response document, which responded to the recommendations made by the WSAB in the *Guidance Advisory Opinion for the 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Plans of Electric Publicly Owned Utilities and Cooperatives*.

This document is intended to simplify the process of reviewing Roseville's current WMP, but does not represent a comprehensive identification of every single update to Roseville's WMP. Further, this summary is not part of or a supplement to Roseville's WMP. Therefore, a full review of Roseville's wildfire mitigation efforts should be based on the actual WMP and Informational Response documents.

2. Roles and Responsibilities

- Roseville provided additional information under "Governance Structure" regarding who has authority to execute and modify the plan.

3. Wildfire Risks and Drivers

- Roseville added language under "Enterprise-Wide Safety Risks" to convey that Roseville performs regular Enterprise Risk Profile analysis to improve the ability to manage risks effectively.

4. Wildfire Preventative Strategies

- Under "Design and Construction Standards" Roseville provided additional information regarding the equipment that we use.
- Roseville also added a new subsection on "Response" which delineates Roseville's protocol for deenergizing portions of our electrical system, depending on the severity and type of situation.

6. Plan Evaluation

- Under "Monitoring and Auditing the Plan" Roseville added language to clarify that a review of the plan will occur by Roseville Electric staff annually or as needed throughout the year.
- Also, under "Monitoring the Effectiveness of Inspections" Roseville added information regarding the metrics that will be used to measure the performance of this plan.
