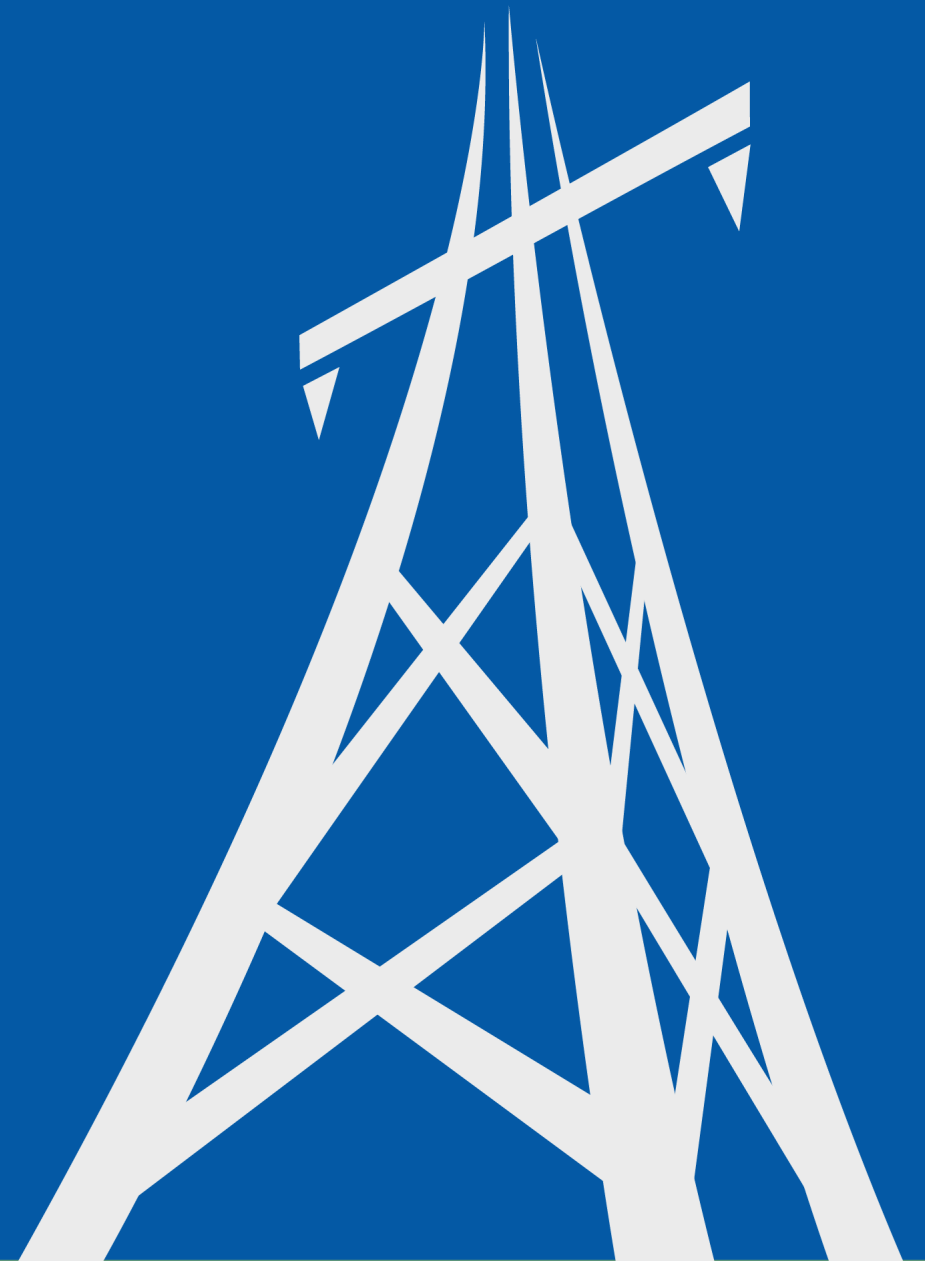

Working Group Structure

Wildfire Risk Modeling Working Group: Proposed Structure



- The working group will begin on 10/20/21, giving participants time to review utilities risk model reports submitted on 10/13/21
- Working group meetings will meet bi-weekly for 4 hours between 10/20/21 and 1/26/22
- Each working group meeting will focus on predesignated topics (such as data sets, verification, algorithms, etc.). The prioritization of topics for discussion will be informed by comments received for this workshop

Wildfire Risk Modeling Working Group: Proposed Schedule



10/20: Modeling baselines, alignment, and past collaboration

11/3: Modeling components, linkages, and interdependencies

11/17: Modeling algorithms

12/1: Fault, outage, and ignition data

12/15: Asset and vegetation data

1/5: Initiative implementation impact, and PSPS risk and impact

1/19: Climate change impacts, suppression and ingress/egress
