Summary of Key Changes in Moreno Valley Utility's 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Plan

October 5, 2021

This document provides a summary of the key changes between Silicon Valley Power's (SVP) current Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) (dated April 2021), and SVP's prior Wildfire Mitigation Plan approved by City Council on June 9th 2020. As part of its 2021 submission to the Wildfire Safety Advisory Board (WSAB), SVP provided an Informational Response document, which responded to each of the recommendations made by the WSAB in the *Guidance Advisory Opinion for the 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Plans of Electric Publicly Owned Utilities and Cooperatives*, issued on December 15, 2020.

This document is intended to simplify the process of reviewing SVP's current WMP, but does not represent a comprehensive identification of every single update to SVP's WMP. Further, this summary is not part of or a supplement to SVP's WMP. Therefore, a full review of SVP's wildfire mitigation efforts should be based on the actual WMP and Informational Response documents.

During the annual review of the Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP), Section V. (B) Weather Monitoring was identified as an area for clarification and update (SVP 2021 Wildfire Mitigation Plan). Those changes are identified in the attached SVP Wildfire Mitigation Plan 2020-2021 Redline Comparison. Specifically, the following updates were implemented:

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- 1. Language was modified to clarify the specific region and assets that the SVP Electric System Operator monitors.
- 2. The monitoring sources were updated and for clarity, the hierarchy of these sources described.

Page 8-9: Risk categories and corresponding actions were modified to reflect the updated legend for wildfire conditions as described on the Northern California Geographic Coordination Center (ONCC) website.

Page 13: Updated to provide clarity related to a bird contact in 2017 and mitigation methods employed to prevent reoccurrences.
