## Summary of Relevant Changes Between the 2020 and 2021 Submittals of the TANC Wildfire Mitigation Plan for the COTP

October 7, 2021

This document voluntarily responds to the August 27, 2021 email request from the Wildfire Safety Advisory Board (WSAB or Board) for a paragraph describing what has changed in the subject Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) from the 2020 and 2021 versions submitted to the WSAB. Consistent with that request, this summary is intended to simplify the WSAB review of that WMP for providing comments and advisory opinions regarding the content and sufficiency of the WMP and recommendations to mitigate wildfire risk.

In support of the Board's review, comments and opinions, we direct the WSAB to the following relevant changes in the 2021 TANC-COTP WMP:

- 1. Page references were added to each row of Table 1-1 (Senate Bill 901 Compliance Requirements and Corresponding Plan Sections; pages 3-4) to expedite location of the corresponding compliance requirement in the WMP.
- 2. The substantive, changes relevant to the Board's review were full revisions to:
- Table V-1 ('Wildfire Prevention, Mitigation, and Response Strategies to Be Implemented in 2020 and 2021') on pages 20 to 22; and
- Table V-2 ('Wildfire Prevention, Mitigation, and Response Strategies to Be Evaluated and Considered From 2020 through 2022') on pages 23 to 28.

Those tables were revised to provide greater explanation and clarity for three elements of each Wildfire Prevention, Mitigation and Response Strategy, including:

- 1. Strategy Description;
- 2. 2020 Progress; and
- 3. 2021 Approach.

Other WMP changes were limited to minor editorial or grammatical revisions.

We respectfully refer the Board to our July 25, 2021 transmittal letter that accompanied the 2021 WMP submittal. It provides important context. Most notably, it explains that TANC is a Transmission [only] agency with no distribution facilities, and only one right of way for the COTP, among several other elements differentiating TANC as a transmission agency.
