Re: Addendum 1 to PG&E's Request for 2023 Safety Certification Pursuant to Public Utilities Code § 8389

Dear Director Thomas Jacobs:

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) respectfully submits this addendum to its request for an annual safety certification pursuant to the requirements contained in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), and (5) of Public Utilities Code (P.U.C.) Section 8389(e). This addendum is provided in accordance with the guidance outlined in the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety's (Energy Safety) final 2023 Safety Certification Guidelines (2023 Guidelines), issued on June 28, 2023.<sup>1</sup>

On December 29, 2023, Energy Safety issued its Final Decision on our 2023-2025 WMP, which concluded that "PG&E's 2023-2025 Wildfire Mitigation Plan is approved."<sup>2</sup> As directed by the 2023 Guidelines, we are now supplementing our application for safety certification with Energy Safety's Final Decision on our WMP.<sup>3</sup> This approval allows PG&E to fully meet the requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 8389(e)(1), which requires that a utility must have an approved WMP in order to apply for a safety certification.<sup>4</sup>
