DECLARATION OF VALERIE BILLE REGARDING CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN DATA PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS § 29200

I, Valerie Bille, do declare as follows:

- 1. I am Vice President, Controller, and Chief Accounting Officer ("CAO") for San Diego Gas and Electric (SDG&E). I have reviewed the confidential information included within SDG&E's Documentation of Compliance with Executive Compensation Provisions of Public Utilities Code § 8389(e) and the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety Guidance ("2024 Executive Compensation Submission") submitted to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety on April 12, 2024. I am personally familiar with the facts and representations in this Declaration and, if called upon to testify, I could and would testify to the following based upon my personal knowledge and/or information and belief.
- 2. I hereby provide this Declaration pursuant to California Code or Regulations Section 29200 to demonstrate that the confidential information ("Protected Information") provided in the 2024 Executive Compensation Submission is within the scope of data protected as confidential under applicable law. Attachment A to this Declaration discusses the relevant provisions of law that allow the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety to maintain the confidentiality of the Protected Information. The Protected Information is also confidential pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission Decision (D.) 17-09-023 and General Order (GO) 66-D Revision 1¹.
 - 3. Based on my knowledge, the Protected Information being provided has not

been publicly published in this form.

- 4. In accordance with the narrative justification described in Attachment A, the Protected Information should be protected from public disclosure.
