Dear Underground Safety Board,

We are writing in response to the Notice of Probable Violation (Case No. N250371836) regarding the incident that occurred on December 20, 2024, at 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, CA.

We respectfully request consideration of the following circumstances:

1. At the time of this incident, our newly appointed project manager, who had limited field experience, was overseeing the jobsite. Unfortunately, due to inexperience,

he did not notify the Regional Notification Center prior to excavation. This was an oversight and not an intentional act of non-compliance.

- 2. When the damage to the 1.5" plastic natural gas line occurred, the project manager immediately took steps to secure the site by taping the damaged line to minimize the leak. He then promptly contacted the SoCal Gas service line to request immediate assistance. SoCal Gas personnel arrived at the site and repaired the damage.
- 3. The project manager did not understand at that time that he was also required to call 911 emergency services in addition to notifying SoCal Gas. His actions were made in good faith, but out of a lack of training and knowledge.

Since this incident, Modern Muse Construction has taken corrective actions:

- We have provided additional training for our project managers and field staff on proper excavation protocols, including the legal requirement to notify 811 before digging and to call 911 in case of any gas release.
- We have updated our internal safety procedures to ensure all future work complies with Government Code sections 4216.2(b) and 4216.4(c)(1).

We sincerely apologize for this incident and respectfully ask that the Board consider these mitigating factors—the inexperience of a new project manager, his immediate action to control the situation, and the prompt engagement of SoCal Gas.



You are receiving this Notice of Probable Violation (Notice) as a result of an investigation conducted pursuant to Government Code section 4216 et seq. The California Underground Safety Board (Board) investigator has concluded an investigation of an incident on December 20, 2024, near 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, California 92841, and found the following violations of Government Code sections 4216.2(b) and 4216.4(c)(1):

Excavating without first notifying the Regional Government Code § 4216.2(b): Notification Center.

Government Code § 4216. 4(c)(1): Excavator failure to call 911 emergency services upon discovering or causing damage to subsurface installation resulting in the escape of flammable, toxic, or corrosive gas or liquid.

On December 20, 2024, Modern Muse Construction was working a jobsite without first contacting the regional notification center and, with a shovel, damaged a 1.5" plastic natural gas line. Upon the escape of natural gas from the subsurface installation, Modern Muse Construction did not call 911 emergency services to report it.

The evidence establishing these facts is attached to the enclosed report of investigations.

Hearing and Referral to Enforcement Agency

During the Board's public meeting on November 17, 2025, at 1:00 p.m., the Board will determine whether the violations occurred and whether the penalties proposed in this Notice are appropriate. You may contest the violations and proposed penalties noted in the below section at this meeting. The location of the meeting will be in Sacramento, California.

Should the Board determine that a probable violation exists, the Board will refer your case with either the proposed penalties below or new recommended penalties to the appropriate state or local agency for enforcement pursuant to Government Code section 4216.6(c) (Enforcement Agency). The Board's recommendation to the Enforcement Agency will include its finding of probable violation and recommended penalties. The Board's recommendation does not constitute a final determination of your case. The Enforcement Agency has discretion to accept, amend, or reject the Board's recommendation, in whole or in part, through its own investigations pursuant to Government Code section 4216.6(c).

Proposed Penalty

Any penalties provided in this Notice, including corrective actions, are only proposals by Board investigator(s) and do not require any corrective action or payment at this time. Your Enforcement Agency will provide the final determination to and instructions for any penalty.

Pursuant to Government Code section 4216.6, violation of Government Code section 4216 *et seq.* by an operator or excavator may be subject to a maximum penalty of \$10,000 for negligent violation, or \$50,000 for knowing and willful violation. Knowing and willful violation of Article 2 that results in damage to a gas or hazardous liquid pipeline subsurface installation and that results in the escape of any flammable, toxic, or corrosive gas or liquid may be subject to a maximum penalty of \$100,000.

The Board Staff are recommending the below corrective action and penalties:

Mandatory completion of the Board's education course. Please see https://energysafety.ca.gov/what-we-do/underground-safety-board/education-course/ for more information.

A financial penalty, the amount to be determined by the Board.

A corrective action to be determined by the Board.

The proposed penalties are merited, on December 20, 2024, Modern Muse Construction was working a jobsite without first contacting the regional notification center and, with a shovel, damaged a 1.5" plastic natural gas line. Upon the escape of natural gas from the subsurface installation, Modern Muse Construction did not call 911 emergency services to report it.

Executive Summary:

On December 20, 2024, Modern Muse Construction was working a jobsite without first contacting the regional notification center and, with a shovel, damaged a 1.5" plastic natural gas line, while cutting roots. Upon the escape of natural gas from the subsurface installation, Modern Muse Construction did not call 911 emergency services to report it. No one was injured and no equipment, other than the 1.5" plastic natural gas line, was damaged.

On February 6, 2025, at 8:18 p.m., Southern California Gas Company submitted a notification of an incident to the California Underground Safety Board. The notification stated, "he damage on our ½ IPS looks like it was cut into when they were cutting a root out. Then they completely cut our plastic service so they can fold it back to control the leak. Their trench is for a sewer line from the back house being built." (Exh. 1.)

The case was assigned to Investigator Gabrielle Zeps (Investigator).

Identity of the Excavator

Government Code section 4216(h) defines an excavator to be "any person, firm, contractor or subcontractor, owner, operator, utility, association, corporation, partnership, business trust, public agency, or other entity that, with their own employees or equipment performs any excavation."

Modern Muse Construction was performing shovel trenching in the dirt (Exh. 2.) at 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, California, 92841 on December 20, 2024.

Modern Muse Construction was licensed, as of March 19, 2025, by the California Contractors State License Board, license number 1077027 with a B-General Building classification. (Exh. 3.)

<u>Modern Muse Construction Did Not Contact the Regional Notification Center Before</u> <u>Excavating</u>

Government Code section 4216.2(b) states that an excavator planning to excavate shall notify the appropriate regional notification center of the excavator's intent to excavate at least two working days, and not more than 14 calendar days, before beginning that excavation.

Modern Muse Construction did not notify the Regional Notification Center prior to starting work at the jobsite. The reason that Modern Muse Construction CEO Giang Vo gave for not contacting the Regional Notification Center before excavation was that his newish project manager forgot. (Exh. 2.)

On March 11, 2025, Investigator emailed Amber Dahl, Safety Awareness Director at DigAlert, requesting ticket information for 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, California, 92841 between November 20, 2024, and January 20, 2025. (Exh. 4.)

Amber Dahl, DigAlert's Safety Awareness Director, responded on March 11, 2025, confirming that a ticket did not exist for 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, California 92841 on December 20, 2024. (Exh. 5.)

Modern Muse Construction Did Not Call 911 Emergency Services Upon the Gas Release Government Code section 4216.4(c)(1) states an excavator shall call 911 emergency services upon discovering or causing damage to a gas or hazardous liquid pipeline subsurface installation in which the damage results in the escape of any flammable, toxic, or corrosive gas or liquid.

Modern Muse Construction damaged a plastic gas line while using a shovel to trench in the dirt, but it did not call 911 after the damage occurred. The reason that Modern Muse Construction CEO Giang Vo gave for not contacting 911 was that the hole was small and that no one else was around. (Exh. 2.)

Findings:

- 1. Modern Muse Construction failed to contact the Regional Notification Center before beginning work on December 20, 2024, at 8902 Adah Street, Garden Grove, California 92841, due to the project manager forgetting to make contact first.
- 2. On December 20, 2024, Modern Muse Construction failed to call 911 emergency services to report the escaping gas from the subsurface installation after it was hit and damaged by a shovel.





- He was not present on the jobsite on 12/20/2024.
- His project manager Hung Vu (still with him) and dirt digger Jairo Barrios (episodic reoccurring hire) were at the jobsite that morning.
- His company was the prime contractor on the job and no other company was at the jobsite.
- Modern Muse had obtained tickets before 12/20/2024. That morning his project manager forgot to call.
- The project manager had not been with him long at that point and he just forgot.
- Jairo Barrios was digging in the dirt with a shovel that belonged to Modern Muse when he damaged the plastic gas line.
- The project manager called SoCalGas immediately and reported the damage.
- The project manager then called CEO Vo and told him what had happened.
- CEO Vo told him to wait there for SoCalGas to come and fix it.
- It was not a big hole, and they came and fixed it quickly.
- No one else was near; no injuries, fatalities, property damage, fire or evacuations.
- He is not aware of anyone calling 911 as no one was around.
- No one call DigAlert after the damage as the job was already done.
- After the damage, he discussed with the project manager that you must always call DigAlert first. It is very important. We were very lucky no one was there. We need to be very sure that we always call first.
- He does not have information about contacting 811 posted but he mentions it every Friday at his safety meetings and at the meeting he has before each job.
